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## **1. INTRODUCTION AND OBJECTIVE**

This Public Participation Plan (PPP) has been prepared by Sharps Compliance, Inc. to comply with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation's Policy CP-29, Environmental Justice and Permitting (CP-29). The purpose of this PPP is to address environmental justice concerns and ensure public participation in the DEC environmental permit review process by the affected community. This PPP has been developed in strict accordance with the procedures established by the DEC under the CP-29.

The objective of this PPP is to inform the affected community that Sharps has applied for a permit from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) for a permit to operate a regulated medical waste (RMW) transfer facility, and to explain the application process requirements within the context of the permit.

The proposed facility is located at 893 Shepherd Avenue in the East New York neighborhood of Brooklyn, NY, which has been designated by the NYSDEC as an Environmental Justice Area.

## **2. EXISTING AND PROPOSED OPERATIONS**

Currently, Sharps use the facility to transfer sealed wastes generated by health care facilities which are deemed "hazardous waste" by State and Federal regulation. Sharps only accepts, stores and transfers sealed containers of such waste. Examples of these hazardous wastes include isopropyl, butyl and methyl alcohols, insulin, nicotine, asthma inhalers, specific pharmaceuticals, vaccines, alcohol based creams and gels, and x-ray developer solution . These hazardous wastes are generated in a broad range of medical, diagnostic, therapeutic and research activities.

The use of this facility to transfer hazardous waste is the subject of an existing NYSDEC Part 364 Waste Transporter permit. A maximum of 2,000 gal. (9.9 cubic yards) of hazardous waste is transferred per day The facility also presently serves as a truck depot for Sharps' collection vehicles and houses administrative offices.

Sharps proposes to add RMW to the health-care wastes which may be transferred at the facility. The facility proposes to accept a maximum of 48 tons of RMW per day. Examples of RMW include used personal protective equipment such as masks, gowns and rubber gloves. Also included as RMW are materials typically used in diagnostic procedures, such as tissue and fluid samples, discarded bandages and swabs, IV tubing and tongue depressors as well as pathological wastes. Used syringes and needles ("sharps"), trace chemotherapy containers and expired pharmaceutical products are also classified as RMW, as are devices typically used to administer insulin for diabetic treatment.

The facility will receive, store and transfer sealed containers of hazardous waste and RMW into long-haul trucks for offsite treatment. The sealed containers of hazardous waste and RMW are collected from local healthcare facilities. Throughout the collection, transport, storage and transfer process (from healthcare facility to offsite treatment) all

containers of hazardous waste RMW remain sealed. Containers will be stored and transferred within three (3) days (72 hours) at ambient temperature from date of receipt. If a longer storage time is needed, containers will be refrigerated for up to seven (7) days from the date the container is received.

Regular operating hours are anticipated to be from 6:00 am to 7:00 pm, Monday through Friday. However, the facility is seeking approval to operate 24 hours per day, seven days per week to allow for infrequent emergency response. The facility has been designed to comply with all applicable City, State and federal regulations. The customer base served by Sharps for the collection of hazardous waste and RMW includes hospitals, doctor and dentist offices, veterinarian clinics, senior living facilities, nursing homes and diagnostic laboratories.

After adding RMW to the current operation, operation of the facility is projected to generate a maximum of 30 box truck collection vehicle round trips per day, 7 long-haul truck roundtrips per day and 14 employee vehicle trips per day. Collection vehicles typically have a maximum cargo capacity of 900 cy and a GVWR of 25,999 lbs. Long-haul transfer trailers typically have a cargo capacity of 1,155 cy and a GVWR of 43,000 lbs. Each collection vehicle will make one round-trip to and from 893 Shepherd each day. The morning peak traffic is projected to occur between 8am and 9 am; evening peak traffic is projected to occur between 4pm and 5pm. The daily distribution of vehicular trips is provided in the table below:


**Figure 1: Maximum Vehicular Trips Weekday Peak Hours**

### **Stakeholders and Outreach Contact List**

## **Proposed Public Participation and Outreach**

To inform the public about the project, provide the opportunity to comment during the solid waste permit application review process, and to address the Commissioner's Policy-29 Environmental Justice and Permitting, a public formational videoconference meeting will be held on June 1st, 2021 at 7pm EST, as a publicly accessible online videoconference.

A public meeting invitation/notice (Appendix C) will be sent to interested parties on the contact list found in Appendix A and published in both an English language and a Spanish language local newspaper as approved by NYSDEC. The public meeting notice, containing instructions on how impacted residents can attend the online meeting and participate in the review process, will be mailed to business organizations and property owners within a 500 ft. radius of the facility and to local stakeholders (Appendix A). The notice will include:

- the time and date of the videoconference meeting;
- directions on how to obtain application materials on the public website;
- instructions on how residents can submit questions or comments via email, writing or telephone;
- the deadline for submitting questions via those alternative methods; and
- a list of telephone numbers and email addresses for relevant contacts.

## **FACT SHEET**

Sharps Compliance, Inc., (Sharps) seeks a NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) Solid Waste Management permit to operate a regulated medical waste transfer facility at 893 Shepherd Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. Application ID# 2-6105-00889/00001. Pursuant to NYSDEC Commissioner Policy 29, Environmental Justice and Permitting (CP-29), a Public Participation Plan and this fact sheet have been prepared and a virtual meeting is being held in order to inform the public about the project and provide the opportunity to comment during the permit application review process.

**Project Description:** Currently, Sharps use the facility to transfer wastes generated by health care facilities which are deemed “hazardous waste” by State and Federal regulation. Examples of these hazardous wastes include: rubbing alcohol; insulin; nicotine; asthma inhalers; vaccines; certain pharmaceuticals and x-ray developer solution. The facility also presently serves as a truck depot for Sharps’ collection vehicles and houses administrative offices. Sharps proposes to add RMW to the health-care wastes which may be transferred at the facility. The facility will receive, store and transfer sealed containers of hazardous waste and RMW into long-haul trucks for offsite treatment. These sealed containers will be collected from local healthcare facilities. Throughout the collection, transport and transfer process (from healthcare facility to offsite treatment) all hazardous waste and RMW containers remain sealed. Regular operating hours are anticipated tube from 6:00 am to 7:00 pm, Monday through Friday. However, the facility is seeking approval to operate 24 hours per day, seven days per week to allow for infrequent emergency response. After adding RMW, operation of the facility is projected to generate a maximum of 30 collection vehicle round trips per day, 7 long-haul truck round trips per day and 14 employee vehicle trips per day.

**What is RMW?** Examples of these wastes include used personal protective equipment such as masks, gowns and rubber gloves. Also included as RMW are materials typically used in diagnostic procedures, such as tissue and fluid samples, pathological wastes, used needles and syringes, discarded bandages, swabs and tubing. Expired pharmaceutical products and trace chemotherapy vials are also classified as RMW, as are devices typically used to administer insulin for diabetic treatment.

**Will the proposed transfer station impact the surrounding community?** Sharps is aware that certain environmental impacts including truck traffic, noise, and air pollution may be of concern. Sharps will eliminate or mitigate these potential impacts by: (1) conducting operations inside the fully enclosed facility behind closed doors; and (2) prohibiting incoming trucks from queuing on public streets; and (3) implementing a rigorous training program. RMW is subject to specific City, State and Federal storage, handling and disposal regulations to prevent adverse impacts.

**How can I participate in the permit review process?** A public meeting overviewing the project will be held as an online video-conference, allowing impacted residents and community stakeholders to submit questions, comments, and concerns about the project. An informational flier including instructions on how to attend the meeting will be mailed to all impacted residents and elected officials. Comments may be provided during the meeting or in writing or by phone up to June 24, 2021; however for comments to be formally considered by the NYSDEC they must be mailed or emailed to the NYSDEC during the 15 day formal comment period from June 9 – June 24, 2021. **Who's responsible for reviewing the permit application?** The NYSDEC, Division of Environmental Permits, 1 Hunters Point Plaza, 47-40 21<sup>st</sup> Street, Long Island City, NY 11101 is responsible for reviewing and issuing the permit. **Descripción del proyecto:** Corrientemente, Sharps utilizan la instalación para transferir desechos generados por instalaciones de atención médica que se consideran "desechos peligrosos" por las regulaciones estatales y federales. Ejemplos de estos desechos peligrosos incluyen: alcohol isopropílico; insulina; nicotina; inhaladores de asma; vacunas; ciertos productos farmacéuticos y una solución de revelador de rayos X. La instalación también sirve, corrientemente, como depósito de camiones de recolección de Sharps y alberga nuestras oficinas administrativas. Sharps propone agregar desechos medicos regulados (RMW) a los desechos sanitarios que pueden ser transferidos a la instalación. La instalación recibirá, almacenará y transferirá contenedores sellados de desechos peligrosos y RMW a camiones de larga recorrido para su tratamiento fuera del sitio. Estos contenedores sellados se recogerán en los centros de salud locales. Durante todo el proceso de recolección, transporte y transferencia (desde el centro de atención médica hasta el tratamiento fuera del sitio), todos los contenedores de residuos peligrosos y de RMW permanecen sellados. Se anticipa que el horario habitual de funcionamiento será de de 6:00 am a 7:00 pm, de lunes a viernes. Sin embargo, la instalación está buscando aprobación para operar las 24 horas del día, los siete días de la semana para permitir una respuesta de emergencia menos frecuente. Después de agregar RMW, se proyecta que la operación de la instalación generará un máximo de 30 viajes de ida y vuelta de vehículos de recolección por día, 7 viajes de ida y vuelta de camiones de larga distancia por día y 14 viajes de vehículos de empleados por día.

**¿Qué es RMW?** Ejemplos de estos desechos incluyen equipo de protección personal usados como máscaras, batas y guantes de goma. También se incluyen como RMW materiales utilizados normalmente en procedimientos de diagnóstico, tales como muestras de tejido y fluidos, desechos patológicos, agujas y jeringas usadas, vendajes desechados, hisopos y tubos. Los productos farmacéuticos vencidos y los viales de trazas de quimioterapia también se clasifican como RMW, al igual que los dispositivos que se usan típicamente para administrar insulina para el tratamiento de la diabetes.

**¿La estación de transferencia propuesta afectará a la comunidad que los rodea?** Sharps es consciente de que ciertos impactos ambientales, como el tráfico de camiones, el ruido y la contaminación del aire, pueden ser motivo de preocupación. Sharps eliminarán o mitigarán estos impactos potenciales al: (1) realizar operaciones dentro de la instalación completamente cerrada a puerta cerrada; y (2) prohibir que los camiones entrantes hagan cola en la vía pública; y (3) implementar un programa riguroso de formación. RMW está sujeto a regulaciones específicas de almacenamiento, manipulación y eliminación de la ciudad, el estado y el gobierno federal para evitar impactos adversos.

**¿Cómo puedo participar en el proceso de revisión de permisos?** Se llevará a cabo una reunión pública que revisará el proyecto como una videoconferencia en línea, lo que permitirá a los residentes afectados y a las partes interesadas de la comunidad enviar preguntas, comentarios e inquietudes sobre el proyecto. Se enviará por correo un volante informativo que incluya instrucciones sobre cómo asistir a la reunión a todos los residentes y

funcionarios electos afectados.
